Kansas Risk Factor Definition

- High Risk Drinking: Routine consumption of ≥ 8 drinks per week or ≥ 4 drinks on any day;
- Binge Drinking: Routine consumption of ≥ 4 drinks within 2 hours

A serving or standard sized drink is:

- 1 can of beer (12 fluid oz.);
- 5 oz. Wine;
- 1 ½ fluid ounces liquor (1 jigger gin, rum, vodka, whiskey (86-proof), vermouth, cordials or liqueurs)

- Any illegal substance use and/or abuse of prescription medications.
- Any marijuana use in any form.

For Breastfeeding women, KWIC will auto-assign if any of the following are true for the current assessment:

- Indication of ≥ 8 drinks per week or ≥ 4 drinks per day from the Now row on ATOD screen
- Illegal Drug Use is selected on ATOD screen
- Misuse of prescription medications is selected on ATOD screen
- Any marijuana use in any form is selected on ATOD screen
