

KDHE Registration to Submit Data for Promoting Interoperability / MIPS

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Eligible providers (EP), eligible hospitals (EH), and critical access hospitals (CAH) planning to meet the Promoting Interoperability (PI) public health reporting measures (formerly known as Meaningful Use) in Kansas must register their intent to submit data to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE). EPs, EHs, and CAHs are responsible for knowing the federal requirements regarding reporting periods for their data submission and attestation purposes. The KDHE PI program maintains only your current active engagement status for data submission and will respond with your status when requested. If your prior registration to submit data covers all the public health measures you intend to submit, you do not have to re-register.

Important Note: EP, EH, and CAH must meet the applicable federal regulations for public health and/or clinical registries. Please refer to the [CMS PI website](#) to view current public health reporting measures, Hardship Exceptions, and Exclusions for EPs, EHs, and CAHs. Active Engagement refers to the process of moving towards sending complete, valid, “production data” to KDHE in a timely manner. EPs, EHs, and CAHs must be in any Active Engagement level measure for data submission to count for PI. Active engagement can be one of the following three levels:

Active Engagement 1 – Registered: The EP, eligible hospital, or CAH registered to submit data with the public health agency or, where applicable, the clinical data registry to which the information is being submitted.

Active Engagement 2 - Testing and Validation: The EP, eligible hospital, or CAH is in the process of testing and validation of the electronic submission of data. Providers must respond to requests from the public health agency or, where applicable, the clinical data registry within 30 days; failure to respond twice within an EHR reporting period would result in that provider not meeting the measure.

Active Engagement 3 – Production: The EP, eligible hospital, or CAH has been moved by the public health agency or clinical data registry into a production phase of electronically submitting production data to the public health agency or clinical data registry. If an issue arises in sending production data, the provider must respond to requests from the public health agency or, where applicable, the clinical data registry within 30 days; failure to respond twice within an EHR reporting period would result in that provider not meeting the measure.
