 - Interesting article on Social Media, pumping, and perceived milk supply - attached with the minutes. Results of study: "...mothers may benefit from additional guidance from health care providers on the limitations of using pumps to draw conclusions about their milk production, the current evidence related to the use of herbal galactagogues, and the importance of responsive infant feeding. These findings also highlight the need for future research into how pumping or using herbal galactagogues may affect mothers' actual or perceived milk production and how styles for providing pumped milk compare to styles for feeding directly at the breast."
 - Referrals in KWIC – make sure that your LA is using the BFPC referral option to refer clients to you. If they mark that they referred a client to any other kind of BF person (CBE, BF educator, etc), there is not a report, so they will be missed as a potential client for the BFPC to follow.
