I. Introduction

Amendment No. 1 adds the following paragraph at the end of the Introduction section:

The 2022 IUP is amended on January 31, 2022 to include additional projects on the Project Priority List.

II. List of KWPCRF Projects

Amendment No. 1 adds the following paragraph at the end of the List of KWPCRF Projects section:

Six new projects for a total of \$194M have been submitted to KDHE for consideration of placement on the Intended Use Plan. These projects will be combined with the projects from the original 2022 Project Priority List (PPL) to create the amended 2022 Project Priority List. The PPL is also updated to include a new project description for the Miami County/Bucyrus project (3047-01) and show the project as being qualified for loan forgiveness. The project description for Arkansas City has been revised to only include facility rehabilitation and a reduced loan amount. The project for Smith Center was determined to be eligible for principal forgiveness, which is reflected in the PPL. The amended 2022 PPL can be found in Appendix A.
