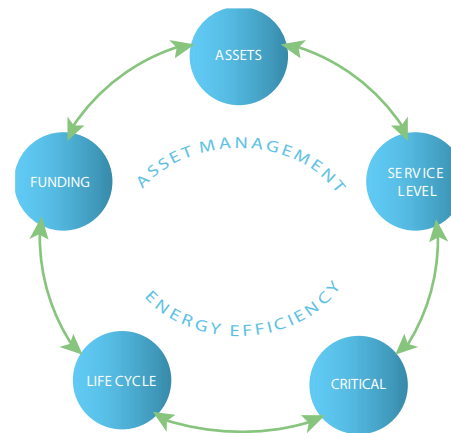
# ASSET MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP FOR UTILITIES - A.M. KAN WORK!
