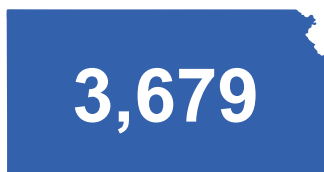


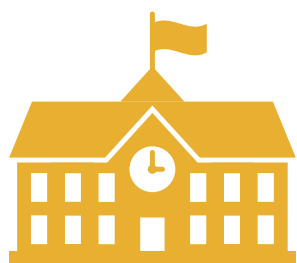
KANSAS VIOLENT DEATHS¹: 2016-2020 FACTS & FIGURES

¹A death from the intentional use of physical force or power against oneself, another person or against a group or community that includes: suicide, homicide, legal intervention, unintentional firearm and undetermined death.

BASIC FACTS

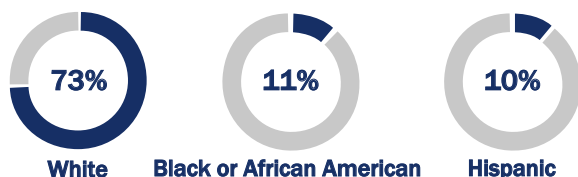


violent deaths occurred in Kansas.



3 in 5 violent death victims (61%) had a high school education or less.

Mortality rate:

Black persons were twice as likely to die by violent death than White, non-Hispanic persons (42.5 vs 24.4 per 100,000).

Rates for Females: Those in **Healthcare Support** had the highest mortality rate about 1.9 times the average of female workers (29.0 vs 15.2 per 100,000 persons).

Rates for Males: The average mortality rate for working males was 59.6 per 100,000 persons. Those in **Farm/Forestry/Fishing** had the highest mortality rate about 2.9 times the average of male workers (171.4 vs 59.6 per 100,000 persons).

²Unpaid including housewife, homemaker, student, disabled, volunteer, patient, inmate or without job. Note: Those in unpaid, military or with insufficient information were excluded from rate calculations.



Veterans (Adults ≥18yrs)

- made up **15%** of violent deaths
- About **3 veterans** died from violent death for **1 non-veteran violent death**



For every **1 Female** who died from a violent death, about **3 Males** died from a violent death.

THE COSTS

Violent deaths cost Kansas a total of

\$38.5 billion (2020USD) from 2016-2020.



Combined medical and value of statistical life cost during that time was an average of **\$14,684 per minute**.



The total violent deaths during this time period reflect **125,496 years** of potential life lost (YPLL) before age 75.
