

We are currently in the process of scheduling sites to conduct hearings on the proposed regulations as well as a public notice/public hearing notice regarding the proposed regulations to be published in the Kansas Register in the near future.

We would appreciate comments from you by May 31, 2004 if you find any problems during your initial review of the regulation package. We will advise you when the formal notice is published in the Kansas Register. Comments from you and your members can be submitted through the public notice process in conformance with the instructions that will be provided in the Kansas Register notice. 
